NEW SPACE FOR CDHS ANIMALS AND STAFF

In January of 2018, CDHS staff moved the administrative offices and all the cats to our new building. In March of 2019, a new addition was opened, adding offices, much-needed storage, and a meeting space. Moving offices to the new addition also allowed us to expand the medical space and quarantine areas in the building.

The new building is a bright and healthy space for people and animals. It's easier to clean and has cut labor, washing, and cleaning costs.

The new cat condos are a more comfortable space for the cats and allow for many of them to have a window view. We also have three free roam cat rooms. Cats that interact well together get to spend their time in these communal rooms and greet visitors.

In the past two years, CDHS has also built a new garage unit and painted the dog building (inside and out), along with remodeling the inside of the dog building. Walls were put up in the aisle and visitor viewing on one side was moved to the back aisle. The purpose for this was so that the dogs would not be looking at each other across the aisle, something that made the dogs a bit more agitated and protective of their space.

Outdoor Space

Our current building has four outdoor patio spaces. One of the patios is used for cats who reside in the kennels. During morning cleaning, on weather

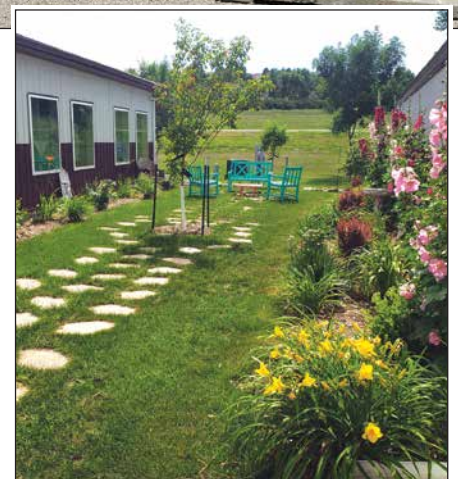

appropriate days, those cats are able to enjoy some outdoor time. Everyone gets a chance to be outside (if they choose) on a rotating basis.

We are currently putting up three additional play yards for the dogs. Funded in part by a grant from the Tom & Frances Leach Foundation, these fenced areas will allow for more play time and a space where potential adopters can interact with the dogs. Volunteers love the play spaces because they are able to play fetch, train, and have fun with the dogs.

If you have not visited our English Garden area (between the shop and the administration/cat building), take a moment to sit a spell. Our dedicated volunteers and staff spend many hours in the summer, beautifying, planting, watering, and weeding to make this space perfect for a moment of respite or reflection. And you can even wave to the kitties in the building who are watching

Shelter Report

I worry that I write about the same things over and over. My work is a strange combination of the same thing day after day, along with the fact that no two days are ever alike. It's reality at the shelter and I can't really

explain it any differently.

We have, on average, 125 animals that need care every single day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. We also help people – by greeting and helping folks at our shelter and taking hundreds of phone calls and messages every week. The requests for our services are so high that I cannot imagine the number of kennels we would require to take in every animal in need.

If we build it, they will come – I am certain of this. Right now, there is a great need for shelters, rescues, and impounds. All of the ones I know of are full and overflowing. We recently received word that Souris Valley Animal Shelter in Minot was closing temporarily in order to remodel and restructure and they asked if other rescues in the state could take some of their 100 residents. Then came the threat of tropical storm Bruce who, as I write this, is bearing down on the Southern part of the U.S., and our friends at the Humane Society of Louisiana have already

contacted us for help. We would like to help them all. Indeed, we would like to help more locally. Where do we start? When will it end? Where can we do the most good? I wrestle with it all and some days the light at the end of the tunnel seems a long way off.

I guess this is where I will continue to preach what I always preach (and hope that you do too.) Spaying and neutering IS the answer to many of the problems we battle today. It's not that adorable puppies and kittens by their own accord are a problem, but it is a huge heartbreaking problem when there are too many of them, and too many of them that are not cared for. We cry for those that freeze, or starve to death, or suffer cruelty or any other mishap that befalls vulnerable lost, strayed, or simply abandoned animals.

We know better and we simply have to start doing better. We are stewards of the earth and caretakers of the animals but we are not doing a very good job at either. Many days it's akin to drawing a bucket of water out of the Missouri River and telling yourself that the river level went down. Yes, the pet overpopulation problem is just that big. But, we focus on the ones we can save no matter the number, and at the end of the day we have earned our rest. 🐾

At our recent Bene-Pet we proudly honored a longtime CDHS supporter. We would like to share his story.

Wendell and Imogene Albert came into our lives in 1994 when CDHS first purchased our current shelter

property. Wendell had come across a stray Black Lab in Bismarck, so he contacted animal control and the dog was taken to Midway Vet Clinic, which was the animal impound at that time. That same day he heard on the local news that CDHS was opening a shelter, which animal-lover Wendell later told us had been a dream of his for a long time. Wendell drove to the shelter and introduced himself to Sue, and asked, "If that impounded Lab has not been claimed, could I "bail it out and bring it to the shelter?" The answer was "yes" so off he went.

It was not very long before Wendell returned with his classic sheepish grin and a small, brown, 10-pound, long haired, mixed breed dog in his arms. He explained that he had gone to the impound and was met with the happy news that the Lab had been reunited with his people. Fantastic! But then Wendell took it a step farther and asked, "Are there any other dogs here whose time is about up?" The answer was "yes" and that's how Wendell

came to be standing in our lobby – not with a Black Lab but instead with this new little canine kid.

We loved this encounter so much that we named this little dog Wendell in honor of the human Wendell who truly saved his life. We are happy to report that "little Wendell" was soon adopted and lived a long and happy spoiled rotten life. We also loved this encounter so much that we created the "Wendell Award," which recognizes hands-on animal rescue and is awarded at Bene-Pet annually.

Wendell and Imogene were faithful monthly financial supporters. Wendell would tell us that the money they shared with us came from Imogene's social security check. When Imogene passed away, Wendell continued his monthly donation to support our life saving work. Sadly, Wendell passed away November 1, 2018, but true to his heart and convictions, he designated CDHS as one of the beneficiaries to his estate. We consider Wendell and Imogene Albert to be a pillar in the foundation that built CDHS. We promise to strive to always do them proud and honor their enduring legacy and their memory. 🐾

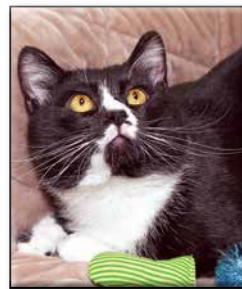

SAVING CAPTAIN AMERICA

Young Captain America, all 2.7 pounds of fluff, was found near Bismarck Expressway, dodging cars with one useless front leg. Successfully navigating that busy thoroughfare with all your limbs can be a challenge. This micro-avenger was smack in the danger zone! Exactly what caused his injury is unknown, but a kind person scooped him up and called us for help. X-rays revealed a distal humeral fracture and bone fragments, basically a shattered elbow. (X-rays also revealed that he had what was likely kitty litter in his colon, which means he had been so hungry he was eating the kitty litter wherever he was living.) We were advised that amputation was the best treatment and surgery was scheduled for a later date. He came to the shelter on pain medications and antibiotics to stabilize for a few days.

Within a few days, his leg and paw started to swell so rapidly that surgery

was needed immediately. In fact, we were advised to not wait until Monday and he had his surgery on a Sunday morning. He got through surgery and spent the next couple days mostly snoozing in my sun room but showing improvement every day. By the middle of the week he was back at the shelter – moving about more, hopping out of his bed, using the litter box like a gentleman and, of course, eating everything we put in front of him.

We are so thankful we could help this furry super star, and we know it is through the generosity of our donors that we can help this little guy grow up and live a long and happy life. By our calculations, he has at least seven lives left.

When we posted his story on Facebook, he touched so many hearts that donations were pledged that completely covered all his expenses with some left over. Captain America truly is a super hero, working to save his world. With more than 20 other motherless



kittens at the shelter, his fund will help us to care for the medical needs of those who are injured, sick, and less fortunate.

Hug your fur kids a little tighter tonight. Keep them inside, keep them safe. Spay and neuter your pets, and help the less fortunate when you can. It's how we can make the world a little better place for all of us. 🐾
