CDHS Staff Will Travel To Minot To Help Care For Pet Flood Victims

The Central Dakota Humane Society will be closed to the public July 2 through July 8 so that CDHS staff members can travel to Minot to help care for pets displaced by the Souris River flooding.

The pet evacuation center in Minot is currently caring for approximately 560 pets. They are in need of donated bedding and cat litter. If you would like to donate, please drop donations at the CDHS shelter and they will be transported to Minot. CDHS will be open from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. through Friday, July 1. After that, please call the shelter prior to dropping off donations.

CDHS continues to care for the approximately 120 animals at our shelter and also is caring for 15 displaced pets from the Missouri River flooding in Bismarck-Mandan.

Central Dakota Humane Society serves Bismarck-Mandan and the surrounding communities by housing and finding homes for lost, strayed or abandoned animals, promoting spaying and neutering and offering educational opportunities.
