TAKING CARE OF HENRY

Our poster boy Henry came to us under some dark circumstances, but together we can promise him a bright future. The story we were told is that Henry was physically abused at the hands of his owner, and was taken to a rural vet clinic by a third party. The concerned person who took him to the clinic did so out of concern for his welfare, but did not have the resources to pay for his medical care. That is when CDHS was contacted regarding his situation.

Henry was legally signed over to that clinic, and we agreed to accept responsibility for him. The initial diagnosis was facial trauma consisting of hemorrhaging, swelling and an injured (believed to be broken) left front leg. The clinic is a rural one, with limited facilities, so that veterinarian believed that his elbow was broken, but elected to hold off doing x-rays since they were limited in their ability to provide the orthopedic procedure that they suspected he would require. So Henry was driven to Bismarck, and we immediately had him assessed at Missouri Valley Vet Clinic.

Dr. Tyler's exam and x-rays confirmed the broken elbow, and surgery was scheduled for the following day. Dr. Tonya Voigt surgically stabilized his elbow with a pin and screw, and successfully gave this little shaver his best chance at a normal life with four working limbs. Then comes the aftercare process, which for orthopedic procedures can be excruciatingly limiting! Strict confinement for eight to twelve weeks. Essentially, cage rest ONLY. Leashed potty breaks. No playing. No running. No interaction with other animals. *continued on page 2*

No jumping. For a young fella like Henry (not even 4 months old) all these rules are no fun whatsoever.

But his youth brings a positive spin to this tale as well, because Henry is a good natured, exceptionally smart little guy, and has taken all these new restrictions in stride. I am confident his youth will have him healing at a very fast rate, both physically and emotionally. Bones take six to eight weeks to heal, that's just a fact. But after his first day with us, the worried forlorn look has already left his eyes, and he was learning to trust people again. He is smart as a whip and now has a constant smile on his face. He is potty trained and already learning some basics about puppy manners. Henry is a happy pup who is anxious to go full speed at leaving his past behind, and having a future of no worries whatsoever – only fun times and companionship as a cherished, much loved family pet!

I know people are wondering about the consequences facing the guilty party, as I am too. I can tell you that the matter has been turned over to the proper authorities, and that CDHS has been asked to provide all documentation of his injuries, as well as the costs involved with his care. Henry has only been with us for a short time, so the rest of his story is yet to be told. We first featured him on Facebook, where his fan base was off the charts. From that initial outpouring of concern we, of course, have had multiple parties interested in adopting him too. We are leaving the legal matter to the authorities and focusing all our attention on his healing right now. Henry is recuperating in a loving foster home, and it's our bet they have already fallen in love, and he will join their family permanently. It's ironic and sad that he had to experience this trauma and abuse to get him to the life he (and every dog) deserves, but I guess that too must be looked at as a blessing in disguise. Again, it is our donors and supporters who enable us to help all the Henrys that come to our door, canine and feline. I hope you share in the immense satisfaction that we all have when we see them transformed from broken or abandoned, to healed, whole and cherished. It's a feeling that I can't describe. And it's priceless.

Our phone is ringing off the hook

Last summer we decided to start tracking incoming phone calls to our office, and I have to admit that the resulting number of calls is surprising. We have compiled some impressive statistics that I think are worthy to pass on to you, so you can get a better idea of the

challenges we face on a daily basis. I went through the monthly totals, and the following are the calls from December 2014 through May of 2015. Six months, two phone lines, and lots and lots of ringing!

Owner surrender cat requests, 104. Owner surrender dog requests, 104. Requests to take in stray cats, 94. Requests to take in stray dogs, 62. Calls regarding lost and found cats and dogs, 147. Abuse and or neglect complaints, 18. Requests for financial assistance for either vet costs or spay/ neuter, 113. Inquiries about medical or obedience issues, 82. Questions regarding a specific shelter cat or dog currently for adoption, 637. Directions to our shelter, 188. General info about CDHS, 376. Questions about volunteering, 301. Miscellaneous other calls not fitting into the above categories, 353, and answering machine hang ups with no message left, 625.

The miscellaneous category is both entertaining and heartbreaking. A few of the notables are, "Do we take turtles? Do we take rabbits? What is the Bismarck Police phone number? What is the number for Human Services? Are service dogs immune from leash laws? Someone reported seeing two rabbits at a golf course. Can we take dogs from Williston? One drunk guy who called three times in a row. What are we supposed to do with our deceased cat? Someone looking for cheap vet care for strays, someone wanted us to deliver a cat to them, do we take rats, do we take sugar gliders? A call about a lost pet in Grand Forks. A call about an injured wild bird. Inquiring about pet friendly housing."

And those are just phone calls, which do not include the visitors stopping in person for assistance, to volunteer or to possibly adopt.

It's now perhaps more understandable why our Macaw, Papagayo, imitates a ringing phone perfectly, just as often as he gives out a friendly "Hi," to almost everyone who comes through the door. Our veterinarian once told us that large birds like Macaws love chaos, so Papa should be a very happy bird. The task for the people is attempting controlled chaos. As you can imagine, as is the case with herding cats, most of our days are very challenging.

Editor's Note: Our telephone answering machine gets quite the workout every day. Even though we recently purchased a new machine, we do notice that sometimes people say they left a message and we never receive it. We suspect our answering machine is getting tired, or is simply dropping some messages. It does get full over the weekends. As we prioritize caring for our shelter pets, helping our visitors and organizing our volunteers, sometimes the phone messages take second or third place in order of priority. Please be patient with us as we work to answer phone messages as soon as possible.

Mandy's Corner

Oh, the things that you may learn from volunteering at the Central Dakota Humane Society:

- 1) The staff and volunteers are a lot of fun, darn
- it! We really are. We have a good sense of humor and when we aren't running around like crazy trying to keep track of what is going on around here, we really do enjoy what we do. As a volunteer, you will get to find out about all the funny stuff that happens around here. You should hang around on a Saturday afternoon between 1pm and 4pm and watch all the action in the parking lot, especially when we have puppies or kitties available for adoption! The shelter director always says, "You can't make this stuff up!" Be part of the fun, not just a spectator.
- 2) You may have a bonding experience with your kids. Yes, believe it or not you can still have fun together and actually bond as a family while helping out a nonprofit that needs your help. If you have children younger than 13, but are at least 7 years old, you might actually have a moment where you and your children leave your cell phones in the car and have a meaningful interaction with each other while enjoying the companionship of a furry bundle of joy. And if the volunteer coordinator catches you texting while walking dogs she will confiscate your phone for the day (just kidding, sort of), ha, ha, ha!
- 3) There are always too many animals. When you are having lunch with your friends or family and they are contemplating their next dog or cat addition to their household, you can tell them what you learned at the shelter. Now being much more worldly because of the time you have spent at CDHS, you can tell anyone who will listen to you, there is always an animal in need and the shelter is always very much over capacity. You may feel terrible when you hear some of the sad stories of where these animals come from but believe me, you will be stronger, better informed and look a lot smarter to your friends and family. You will always have the inside track to what is going on at CDHS because you spent time here loving on the critters for a few hours a week.
- 4) Cats need just as much love as dogs. When I first started working at the shelter I didn't really "get" cats. Now that I share my office space with a few of them, and have had to crawl around under the trees right outside the building occasionally looking for Mort the lobby cat that likes to escape through open doors, I appreciate them more. As a volunteer

you will too. You might just be shocked at how nice and adorable they can be and your world may just become a bigger, better place with some cat on your furniture after you take the plunge and adopt a cat.

- 5) Pit Bulls are not nearly as scary as you might think. I will admit I was always a "little dog" person. I have three dogs and two foster dogs and they are little guys. I started going once a week to the KFYR morning show almost two years ago and guess what? There aren't always little dogs available to take on TV. So I have to take whoever is available. Sometimes Pit Bulls are the only dogs that are available and I have learned (and you will too) that they can be some of the most fun loving dogs here at the shelter and with love, care, training and exercise they can make wonderful pets. They are usually the ones that are abandoned, surrendered and not allowed in many places because of the bad reputation they get. Another thing you can tell your friends at lunch that will make you look smart!
- Give the old cats and FIV cats a chance. You 6) will see old cats at the shelter. They may be grumpy, depressed, and hate the situation they are in, but who could blame them. Some of their owners have passed away or they were declawed and reacted badly or they didn't react well to the new baby in the house or their fur was the wrong color that didn't match the couch so they ended up here in a cage instead of on their comfy cat condo in front of the window. Open the cage, let them sniff your hand, attempt to pet them and you will see how incredibly important you are to that cat. You may be the first person that day that gave that cat your undivided attention and when you look into his or her eyes you will surely see the grateful, gentle softening and you can almost hear them sigh "thank you" in their eventual purr.
- 7) Sometimes you aren't just there for the animals. Yes, the animals are your major concern as a shelter volunteer, but the staff needs you the most. The staff is constantly sweeping, mopping, filling bowls, tidying litter boxes, washing towels, mainly doing all the dirty work, but they don't seem satisfied and not because their job is drudgery: they want the animals to be loved, and they don't have time for them. These critters are their pets and they love that you treat them like your pets when you are here. Yes, the staff might get crabby sometimes because they see a lot of bad stuff, but when they see you volunteering they are grateful and thankful that you are

willing to spend time with their friends.

8) Sometimes you don't have time to pet the animals. The staff at CDHS



is amazing, quick, and organized to the best of their abilities, but they need more people that they just don't have the money to hire. That's where volunteers come in handy – giving your time to any organization helps alleviate unnecessary stress from jobs undone because you are there to help. Sometimes you just have to ask if there is anything else that needs to be done and you will get a job you didn't intend to do that day. Or you might get off easy that day and just get to pet and love on dogs and cats.

- 9) You'll get attached to an animal, and then it will get adopted. You will meet cute kittens and puppies and you will get attached. Eventually a scared dog you've been working with will let you pet him and will make eye contact with you. You will know that because of your touch, your care and your time, you taught that animal how to love and trust again and you......YOU....made the difference between that animal living for one more month at the shelter or going to their new forever home.
- 10) There is a soul in each and every animal, they each have their own story to tell and they should be treated with respect. This reason is the best reason to volunteer at a shelter. and it's a lesson I truly believe will ultimately sink into your own heart. Maybe you weren't raised with animals in your household or are not allowed to have a pet in your apartment or maybe you just want your kids to get their animal "fix" without it being your 24-houra-day job to take care of a dog or cat. All of these things are important and worthy reasons to volunteer but you just may experience a deeper, more meaningful experience than you are prepared for. My advice is to take the dog walking class or the cat orientation and open your heart and mind to a new experience and try not to think, "I could never work there. I would be too sad." or "I'd want to take all the cats and dogs home." Like I said in the beginning, "We are a lot of fun here!" And the critters here are provided with medical care and food, well taken care of and loved by our staff and our volunteers while they wait for their forever homes.
