BUSTING MYTHS & SHARING THE FACTS ABOUT FIV

First, they fell in love. One thing Cricket (formerly Kingston), Kiwi (formerly Boomchickapop), Rainy, Charlie (formerly Starkey), and Thomas Patrick have in common is how effectively they tugged at their future adopters' heartstrings.

"I was online and saw a photo of Cricket," Quinn Oberlander said. "And my thought was not, 'I think I'll get a cat,' but 'I want THAT cat'."

Charlie had a similar effect on Nicole Martineson, who was on staff at CDHS when she met her kitty-to-be. Working primarily with the dogs, Nicole didn't have a lot of day-to-day contact with the cats. But she noticed Charlie immediately.

"He was a little banged up from being a stray – it was his personality that made him beautiful, "Nicole said of her now 11-year-old kitty she adopted five years ago. "Honestly, I was hoping he wouldn't get adopted before I could figure out if I could adopt him or not. People were just drawn to him."

Then they found out what these five cats also have in common – all have feline immunodeficiency virus (FIV).

"I remember I'd gone into a visiting room with another cat and we were obviously not 'feeling it'," Kennedy Jacob said. "I walked out and saw Kiwi sitting in the windowsill, and I was like, 'Why's she in that little room? "I was told, 'That's the FIV room.' I had no idea what FIV was."

So Kennedy – like Quinn, Nicole, Tana Pendergast (Rainy) and Chris Henderson (Thomas Patrick) before her – did the research. Before adopting, they talked with CDHS staff and their veterinarians, and checked veterinary school websites and other credible online resources to find out what being "FIV-positive" means – they learned the facts to bust the widespread myths.

"Information on the internet is all over the place: 'death sentence,' 'constant illness' ... I had 'worst case scenario' on my mind." Quinn said. But, between her research using credible information sources and seven years of living with the now almost 9-year-old Cricket, she knows better. "We've had some bumps in the road but, for the most part, he's healthy."

What FIV actually means is that cats who have the virus

have weakened immune systems. Just as a human whose immune system is weak due to illness or a chronic health condition often picks up a cold or the flu more easily than a person with a healthy immune system, FIV-positive cats have a greater chance of becoming ill when exposed to contagions. And, when they do catch something, it's likely to hit them

harder than it would a cat with a healthy immune system.

Having this knowledge of FIV facts brought power – the power to overcome the myths. "The biggest myth is they just think it's a death sentence – even when you try to explain that they live to 11, 12 years old or more," said Tana, a current CDHS volunteer and former staff member, who fostered now 3-year-old Rainy as a bottle-fed orphan. "FIV is not death. Yes, they can pass away at a younger age, but they can also live into old age. Even FIV-negative cats can die early from genetic things like kidney failure – the same thing can happen to us."

Some people prefer to segregate cats who have FIV, which is primarily spread through deep puncture wounds such as bites. For aggressive cats who are likely to fight or play hard, that's probably a good idea. However, as Tana, Nicole, and Chris have discovered, non-aggressive FIV-positive and FIV-negative kitties can live in harmony.

"I spoke with [CDHS Director] Sue Buchholz about it, and she suggested slow introductions and to go from there. So I kept them separate for about three weeks," said Nicole, who also has two FIV negative cats. "I let Charlie hang out in my bedroom; Sunny knew he was in there and they played with each other underneath the door. I'd swap rooms every once in a while, so they could get each other's scent. A few weeks later, I cracked the door a little."

"There was never any aggression from Charlie," she continued. "Sunny was a little reserved at first, but she didn't hide or anything. They've coexisted ever since."

Thomas Patrick's introduction to the Henderson's five-cat household was similar. A CDHS staff member at the time, Chris started out fostering Thomas Patrick in 2016 while he healed after being hit by a car. When the time came for him to return to CDHS for adoption, she couldn't bear to part with him.

"He was in a room by himself, and he and our kitties sniffed each other and got to know each other under the door," she said. "Then we cracked the door and he'd come out a little bit, and then get nervous and go back in. So it was very gradual. There was never any fighting. They get along really well."

Kennedy, Quinn, Nicole, Tana, and Chris all agree that getting the facts about FTV and being proactive where their FTV kitties health is concerned is essential. For Nicole, Tana, and Chris, who have other cats, assessing personalities and making slow introductions was just as important. Other than that, Cricket, Kiwi, Rainy, Charlie, and Thomas Patrick are just members of their feline families. •

Thankful for the Challenges

It is with much gratitude and

thankfulness that I start out this new year. Not so much for the frigid temperature that is just outside my window, for that brings its own challenges for animals and people alike. I'm deeply grateful for another year of plowing through every day, but knowing animals are safe and warm because of all our efforts and your unwavering support. They say attitude is everything and no matter how or where you work or play-your attitude can make or break you. I am not blind to the wounded, the cruel humans and the tough cases, death, divorce casualties, injured and strayed, moving and can't take my pets along, good intentions gone horribly wrong or any of the other of the varied assortment of reasons people seek our assistance. Every. Single. Day. Yes, it is why we are here, and our supporters should share in our successes 100%.

These past few months have been especially challenging as a record number of people have contacted us requesting assistance with stray cats or owned cats to surrender to our care. I am deeply thankful for our \$40 discount spay/neuter assistance coupons that prevented litters for 720 area cats and dogs in 2019. That adds up to \$28,800 annually, but is a program we will dig deep to continue funding. This year we stand strong to do it all again all because of you. Attitude truly is everything! 🖮

LEAVING A LEGACY FOR THE ANIMALS





PUP-DATE — SICKLY, ABANDONED DOGS ON THE ROAD TO GOOD HEALTH

In early December a gentleman contacted us about some puppies that were living in a barn on his neighbor's property. It sounded like it was an unused barn, and a momma dog must have taken shelter there and had her puppies. It appears the mother did her best for her babies, but sadly she was found dead.

The Red Heeler cross puppies were about five months old and weighed between eight and 10 pounds. They should have been in the 20-25 pound zone. They were given baths, many small meals, and lots of love. They were treated for giardia, an intestinal parasite. After the giardia was taken care of, they then tested positive for coccidia (another intestinal parasite), and were treated for that.

They have put on quite a bit of weight, getting back to a normal size for their age. They are getting love, lots of good food, and medical treatment from the shelter staff, and are learning some manners. These lucky pups are currently ready for adoption.




