(Tuesday 9:54 pm) Sue set up a kennel in her garage and came to get him so she could get him to the vet right Boop the Cat visited the right yard and the right person, who knew he needed help. He is now safe at CDHS and on the mend.



Shelter Report

By Sue Buchholz. Shelter Director Love Your Dog, Train Your Dog

I am happy to say that like everyone else, we are delighted to have our world edging closer back to "normal." This past year was one none

of us could have predicted and we all made many adaptations to keep ourselves and our loved ones safe. The shelter was closed to the public for a short time, but staff was here every single day caring for the animals. As time passed, we opened back up by appointment only, scheduled volunteers to control traffic flow, and started to adapt to a new way to accomplish our mission.

One thing in the "shelter chatter" world in the beginning

of the pandemic was a concern that homebound people would adopt pets and then surrender those animals once they returned to the work office instead of the home office. I am happy to report that we are not seeing much of this at CDHS, but that does not mean the requests for our services are down. Appeals for help remains constant – every month, every week, every day.

One scenario we are seeing much too often is young adult dogs that have received little or no socialization or training. These neglected dogs are like ships with no rudder. Someone has purchased them or adopted them and then has dropped the ball.

We recommend that those looking to adopt a dog: 1) do their research, 2) know their lifestyle, and 3) be prepared to make a commitment. If they cannot answer

some questions with honesty, maybe the time is not right for a dog to come into their life.

Our advice: Research breeds and breed characteristics and think about the next 15 or so years of your life. What will likely change in my life? What are my plans and goals? Where will I be living? Am I active or more of a relaxed person? What type of dog fits my lifestyle? Can I commit to caring for this critter for its lifetime? Once you have all the answers and have done all the research and chosen your dog, your work REALLY begins!

Now I am not a dog trainer, but I have visited with some pretty good ones over the years. Socialization and training ARE the absolute key to teaching your new family member what you expect of them and to help them be comfortable and confident in most situations. Many people observe a timid dog and comment "oh, he must have been abused." That could be so, but not training with your new best friend can produce the

same negative results. Not putting in the time cheats your dog and yourself out of the positive experience you most likely envisioned when you started thinking about adoption in the first place.

The frustrating thing for shelter employees and volunteer foster homes is to have to start at the beginning of training and socializing a dog that is nine months or older, which is starting way behind the eight-ball, so to speak. The training process is easier than you can imagine if started when they are young. Meeting new people and other animals in a controlled setting, touching them all over, handling their feet and ears (your

> veterinarian and groomer will also thank you for this) are all small things that add up to major differences in the proper development of that animal.

> Puppies are a clean slate and a little work and time on the front end will lead to a lifetime of happy dog companionship. If, for some reason, your circumstances do change and you will be much easier as well, for everyone and personalities, all coming from varied

must rehome your animal, that process involved. At CDHS we care for all types of dogs, (and cats) with an array of ages circumstances and life experiences or lack thereof. Each is treated as an individual and we work with trainers and veterinarians to alleviate fears and heal wounds, both physical and emotional. But so much of what we see

all comes back to not providing training and socialization when they are very young. Our advice is to properly deal with these challenges early before the issues compound themselves and the situation becomes unworkable. Many resources are available in our area for training. Please reach out to us – we can offer many suggestions and references.

If you have read through to the end of this article, you may be wondering why I am "preaching to the choir." I know many of you are animal lovers and advocates, so I encourage you all to help us spread this message. Talk to your friends, family, and neighbors about their pets and help us promote proper and responsible pet care. Offering tips and resources in a helpful, non-judgmental way just might be life-changing words for the people and the pets. You can help us save lives and help pet parents create the life-long bonds we all enjoy and cherish. We have always said we cannot do this work alone. Your voice is powerful and needed. 🦮

Volunteers, Love and Loss

Volunteers are amazing and do so much more than walk the shelter dogs or play with the cats. We all know

that to be true. Volunteers help our shelter animals learn that a hand offered to pet, give treats, or hold onto a leash can take them to magical places with good smells, fun runs, and many other adventures. Volunteers offer a lap and a presence to a scared animal that has just come into the shelter because their owners could no longer care for them, or they became strays for some reason we will never know. Volunteers offer love and companionship to shelter animals and for the time that those animals are with us here at CDHS, they share a bond with a person that benefits both the animal and the human.

Some of the animals that live here at the shelter are here for a few short weeks and some are here a year or longer. Some animals are ill or injured when they arrive or become ill during their stay at CDHS. Some of our shelter residents do pass away while in our care. For some animals, the saddest time or scariest time of their lives is softened by a kind volunteer who helps them through this tough transition.

Volunteers also benefit greatly when they offer that end-oflife love. They feel deeply the loss when a shelter animal passes. The grief that the volunteers feel is just as real and raw as if it were their own pet. The staff, volunteers, and animals are part of a family that has a bond and when that bond is broken by a death, the loss is hard. Processing the loss is part of healing. Remembering the fun, happy, and great times the volunteers had with that animal is all part of the steps to feeling better.

Recently, in a short period of time, we lost two puppies to illness, several kittens who died at birth, long-term resident

Toblerone, and lovable pit bull Kaiser. Kaiser was a volunteer and staff favorite who had heartworm and suffered a massive heart attack. His death was sudden and we were all shocked and saddened and it took a moment for us to catch our breath. The volunteers who knew and loved shared a communal sadness. The volunteers and staff took some time to share memories of their time with him and remembered many "Kaiserisms." This memorial service for



Kaiser provided healing and allowed us to realize that the days he had at CDHS were happy ones. He formed many friendships and the walks and kisses and time he spent with the volunteers were rich and happy. Kaiser inspired people to live for the moment, just like he did! One of our amazing dog walkers, Ron, said it best when he mentioned a quote he had heard – "Joy shared is joy multiplied...and grief shared is grief divided." Yes, there is sometimes sadness and loss, but for the animals that have their lives touched by the volunteers at CDHS, there is also love. And the volunteers also receive that love back. So very much love!





Ongoing Learning Helps Staff And Shelter Dogs

Simply feeding and providing water and shelter to a puppy is like letting a child run wild until the first day of kindergarten. Technically, the puppy - and child - would be physically similar to others his age. But, without a sound foundation in appropriate behavior, he would have no understanding of how to interact with others.

Strays may never have had the opportunity to learn these skills and, all too often, animals surrendered to CDHS also arrive with a lack of the basics. They don't understand what they're supposed to do, so what they actually do is destructive, appears to be – or is – aggressive, or in some way isn't much fun for their people.

It's then up to shelter staff to undo the damage and instill those basics. Sounds pretty straight-forward, right? Afraid not. Just like people, no two animals are alike. They have different triggers that prompt negative behaviors, and different views about rewards, too. One kiddo's reward - a good stroke or ear scratch - could feel like punishment to another.

How do we tell the difference? What do we do when nothing else is working? Different dogs, different answers - and they don't come with instructions. Which is why shelter staff is constantly learning, seeking out new information through

workshops, conferences, advice from local trainers, and, with the advent of COVID. the greater availability of webinars and virtual training sessions (often for free or at minimal cost).

Currently, staff is taking advantage of sessions from the Virginia Stillwell Academy's 2021 Dog Behavior Conference. The sessions, each presented by an expert in that field, delve into specifics about the shelter environment and interaction with potential adopters; the differences between how people and pets interpret the world around them; how to effectively work with various age groups, temperaments, and behavior difficulties: and a number of other behavioral and socialization topics.

"It helps to learn ways to make them feel more comfortable in the kennel environment, as it's unnatural for them," said dog building staff member Makayla, adding that it's always good to learn more ways to work with reactive dogs and varied dog behaviors.

Our favorites training subjects, of course, are the puppies – they're open to everything, and they absorb learning like little sponges. Youngsters are the perfect age to teach the basics, to build that good foundation that will help them be wellbehaved family members for life.

"I think that anything we can use to help us work better with the dogs, to help them more, is awesome," said Kaysi, Dog Building Lead. "I don't think there's been one [training session] that I haven't learned something from. Our goal here is to get them a home, and anything we can do to help them get adopted is a positive."
