# **Kittens All Alone, But Safe at CDHS**

The story is the same, again and again – kitten is found all alone or with just one sibling, no momma, no other sibs. How they survive and how they come to be found is always a wonder. Kittens are found along the walking path, in a car engine, in a boat that was hauled from another city, in a parking lot – we've heard it all.

You would think that since they are so little, we should be able to just tuck the little buggers into a corner and they wouldn't take up much room. While it is true that the kitties are little, one or two little kitties fill up a whole kennel space and generally require extra care because they are usually sick with upper respiratory, worms, ear mites, ringworm, any number of afflictions.

The good news is that when they come to us little, if they are feral or skittish, they are pretty easily turned around and find that they love human attention and affection. Sometimes they just need a little extra time – getting petted or getting wrapped up in a blanket like a burrito for some snuggling. Thankfully most of them decide that liking people is easier than being scared and fighting back.

To open up more space and to provide kitties with a friend, if they are healthy we have been trying to combine pairs of single kittens into one kennel. Sometimes it is a perfect match, but sometimes these littles have an attitude and do not want a roommate. Soon enough all the solo kittens will be healthy and socialized and ready for adoption. Then we will be ready for more cats and kittens to fill those kennels. Surely there will be no shortage.

# Shelter Report

### By Sue Buchholz, Shelter Director Maintaining Capacity for Care While Helping Many

There is definitely something in the air. This long-awaited spring and summer does much to lift the spirits,

but it seems like a cloud is always lurking and we all feel it. COVID, illness, or the loss of loved ones, the economy, supply chain breakdowns, wars, mass shootings, etc. I could easily go on and on. We can each personalize it and add many things to this list, for there are many battles for all of us to fight every single day. Naturally, these things all trickle down and affect our pets as well. People have struggles we cannot understand and often that affects their abilities to care for their pets. Desperate people do desperate things, and we are seeing more and more pets being dumped. Our phone rings continually through the day, 10-20 calls, emails, and Facebook messages each day, asking us to take owned pets.

To put it simply, our shelter is bombarded. All other local rescues claim the same, and I am positive that is true. This past week CDHS received calls from animal rescues in Minot. Dickinson, and Jamestown asking if we had any room to take in animals. Twenty stray cats in Wishek. Dogs roaming on Standing Rock. Rescues and animal control officers are all reaching out to see if anyone has any space at the inn. I get it. And it is not a localized problem. In the past two weeks I have received email requests from animal shelters in Alabama, Pennsylvania, and Texas asking if we could accept any animals! We had to say no to all. I took a phone call from a man in Mandan that was concerned about some feral cats he has been feeding. I told him that truly feral cats do not do well in a confined shelter, and even if they could be tamed, that we had a list of cats (and dogs) waiting to come into the shelter. He said, "You have been saying that for 20 years." And he is not wrong. We absolutely have been saving this for years, for the simple reason that it is

the truth. Every adoption means we have space to take in another, that's how it works. Thankfully adoptions continue, but often summer or school activities take first place, and our pace slows down a bit.

While we can throw together some temporary housing in urgent situations, we must always be mindful of something we call Capacity For Care. Every animal shelter encounters ringworm, parvo, upper respiratory infections, a



laundry list of conditions we must watch for every day and be aware of when treating and caring for our animals. Depending on each situation pets must be isolated and contact with people and other animals must be limited. Besides the animals you see available for adoption we have many more animals in nonpublic areas that are on intake hold, being treated, monitored, or otherwise prepared for eventual adoption. The quality of care every animal at CDHS receives is very important to us and plays a factor in how many we can care for on any given day.

At CDHS we acknowledge that we have limitations in our housing capacity. Granted, to an extent we have to have 'rubber walls,' and emergencies have, more than once, required us to put wire kennels in offices, storage areas, and even the staff. It's like Jenga, animal shelter edition. Day in and day out this work is exhausting, never ending, heartwarming, and heartbreaking, and

> all that comes before noon. But we dearly love these animals, and we know we are providing a vital resource in our community. Our life saving work is important and we are a lucky few to have a thick enough hide to do it. On average we house 125 cats and dogs at our facility, plus the ones in foster homes. No matter how challenging things get in our own neighborhoods or around the world – we pledge to be here and do all we can for as many as we can. It has been said to make a change in the world you start in your own community. At CDHS we provide that positive change every single day, and we do it with the support of our dedicated donors. We are truly thankful for each and every one of you.

had a rough life before arriving here."





# Having a Blast on Band Night


