
who get along with all other cats in the room. They have made fast friends of the kittens who live with them, but they remain each other's BFFs.

Shelter Report

The Cost of Sheltering and How We Make It Work

Abandoned, neglected, injured animals – every week is a new week, but the constant is that every week, more of these

unfortunate pets enter our doors. A very small number (about 3 percent so far this year) are fast turnarounds, quickly reclaimed by their people. Why are so few reclaimed? We ask this question almost daily and have found no good answers. But, I digress.

At CDHS, we make a large investment into the animals that were once cast aside. We believe these pets have worth and so we invest our time and money to provide them with care, make them healthy, teach them social skills, and get them adopted into loving homes where they will never be discarded again. It is quite the undertaking, but we do it with love in our hearts, a belief in the amazing qualities of the animals, and help from our supporters, like you, who also know the value of a well-loved pet.

Most cats and dogs that enter our shelter need several things immediately. Food, water, toys, a soft bed, and a roof over their head. Shelter staff immediately gives a distemper vaccination (if age appropriate) and dewormer. The journey to good health has started. As soon as possible, we get these new pets into our veterinarian for a health checkup and a rabies vaccination. Any minor injuries or other health problems are also addressed at this visit. If the pet entered our care with an emergent injury or health concern, we get them to the vet immediately for care and medication.

Pets are on a 10-day rabies vaccination holding period before they can interact with the public or become available for adoption. After three weeks they will need another distemper booster. If over four months of age, that vaccination will last them a year. If they are under four months of age, additional vaccinations are given when needed. We repeat the initial worming in 10 days. And at some period in between so as not to overwhelm their system, they will get a tapeworm medication as well, and a flea and tick product is applied. Every animal is spayed or neutered prior to adoption and every animal is microchipped.

Those are the very basics, and none of them are free. In fact, like everything else in the world, the costs of everything continue to rise at an alarming rate. Keep in mind there is the daily food, water, medicine, and the employees to provide these basics. We have multiple washing machines that run non-stop all day long. We pay the lights, the heat and AC, insurance, and fuel costs. The same things we all need to live, our animal friends need too!

We work hard to provide everything our shelter pets need, and we are forever grateful that our supporters provide us with monetary donations, and SO much MORE! The "more" is the UPS truck delivering donations supplied from our Amazon wish list or folks walking in the door with bags and boxes full of items we can use. Dog toys, kitty litter, over-the-counter medications, all these things help us focus our checkbook on the veterinary care and medical emergencies that come to us.

The "more" is also seen every day when our awesome volunteers show up rain or shine, hot or cold, to spend some time with our fur kids in waiting. The dedication of these volunteers absolutely astounds me every single day! Their love for the dogs is obvious with every easy

walk or energy burning run around our beautiful property. We have multiple large, fenced areas for off-leash shenanigans, whether it be learning about stairs that are not that scary once conquered, or just a chillin' hole that needs digging.

And the kitties have their fan clubs too, from quiet petting to crazy laser pointer antics, we have cats for every activity level. To simply house them on its own is a daunting task, but the volunteers truly fill the gaps and provide the one-on-one time they all desperately need.

The "more" is folks who share the love for CDHS and the pets on social media, who talk to their friends and neighbors about the importance of spaying/neutering and proper pet care, who encourage their coworkers to adopt rather than buying a pet from a pet store. Your efforts are helping pets every day.

Other costs that we have chosen to incur include supporting two great community programs. One program is Buddy's Bowl, that helps to fill the bowls of pets in need. Our annual budget of \$10,000 for this program is an investment in helping to keep pets in their homes – pets that might otherwise be entering a shelter or rescue because the cost to care for them is too great for the family. We feel the cost of the program reduces the burden on our shelter and maintains the love of a pet that a family needs, especially in times of strife.

Our other program is the Spay/Neuter Assistance Program and comes with an annual budget cost of \$60,000. That's a huge number, but it's a number we believe is needed to enable people to get their pets spayed and neutered. I'll say it until I can no longer speak, we cannot shelter ourselves out of our pet overpopulation crisis! The answer is preventing litters in the first place. There are simply not enough adopters for all the homeless animals already in our community. Period. No debate. The Bismarck/Mandan impound is at max capacity often, and lately has stopped the intake of animals found in the city limits. All the local rescues are at maximum capacity, and there are more rescues in this area than ever before! We truly are facing a crisis every single day, and we must invest in working to reduce the numbers of unwanted pets. Humans have created this problem, and it's up to humans to solve it. We are doing our part.

Yes, the cost of sheltering and caring for pets in need is great, but we have been working at this worthy endeavor in our current shelter location for nearly 30 years. Every day is a new day, with different costs and different challenges, but oh, so many rewards. We plan to continue saving animals and matching them with loving families far into the future. We plan to continue spreading information about the importance of spaying/neutering and responsible pet ownership. We plan to continue taking in the broken, homeless, uncared for pets, and making them feel loved.

And we can't do it without you. You have been there for us for decades and we hope you will continue to come along for the journey in any way you can. We are forever grateful for everyone who donates, supports, and partners with us, in every way possible, so that we can do this amazing work – providing a temporary home, love and care for our faithful, voiceless friends. They would do the same for us if they could!

"Update on Dibs (now Victor)... he is doing really well. In the beginning he was very afraid of any new rooms so took our time from area to area and he now seems much more relaxed all over the house. Pretty afraid of new visitors so will take that slowly.

 Our oldest cat was not too happy at all with this new addition



so we had to take quite a bit of time with them with short meetings. It is getting better as you can see from the photo below. Victor is very passive with both of the resident cats so that helps a lot. And he actually has tons of energy, so we have daily play sessions with feathers on sticks. He is pretty goofy and sweet, and we are so happy he came to live with us.

Also on his health, we just finished weaning him off of the steroids per the vet and will see how he does. Mostly just has a watery eye so we try to keep his face clean daily."






