Kittens Abound

We've had a late summer filled with litters of kittens born at CDHS. Mommas Mae, Penelope, and 2% each gave birth to their babies at the shelter. Several other mommas came into CDHS this summer with kittens as well, and many kittens came in all alone. The kitten pipeline is full and always flowing, that's for sure!

While kitten season used to happen around the beginning of spring and summer, it seems that kitten season now lasts all year long. We expect to continue seeing litters born at the shelters and lots of kittens coming in throughout the fall and winter. Personal pets that are allowed to wander, those that are simply kicked out, and those born in the wild - when not spayed/neutered ends in many impregnated cats – with FAR too many kittens for the homes available. The kittens and mommas that find their way to CDHS and the other rescues are the lucky ones. Imagine all those that must suffer and perish from disease, harsh conditions, parasites, predators, or unkind humans. This overflow is the reason why CDHS mandates that all pets adopted from us must be spayed/neutered before they leave the shelter. We simply can't think of adding one more kitten to the already overwhelming problem of TOO MANY cats.

When you are ready to add a kitten (or kittens!) to your family, please stop out to visit at CDHS. Don't forget about our 2-for-1 adoption fees for kittens and cats. Most cats, especially kittens, thrive with a friend for playtime and comfort. We want to support their emotional and physical

Shelter Report

What's Been on my Mind

While I love Summer with its longer days,

warm weather, and all the other activities it allows, I am not gonna lie, this past one bowled me over like no other. After several months of a creeping decline, my 87-year-old Mom passed away on June 23. The emotions and responsibilities that come with all that entails are not for the faint of heart. There is nothing unique here, I know that. Death is something we all face with family, friends, people we love, people we rely on, and people that we cannot imagine living our lives without. No one is immune to facing this loss, and it can be devastating. Navigating a new normal takes time and determination.

Then in August I lost one of my personal dogs to old age. Not entirely unexpected, but Molly (McButter) took up a chunk of my heart and home for 15 years. It sucks. Then in September I took another of my dogs to the vet for a suspected urinary infection. My hope was that a round of antibiotics would fix her right up. A couple of tests later and an ultrasound revealed the devastating diagnosis of multiple liver tumors. Her time on this earth was limited to a few short weeks and I had to say goodbye to Bella (Lugosi Pavarotti).

Three crushing blows in three months leave a lot of empty space in one's gut. No more hospice care. No doctor appointments. No more allergy medication, no more probiotics, no more insulin injections or special diets, but I would take up those tasks again in a heartbeat to have them all back. It's a very difficult adjustment, and again, my situation is no different than the multiple challenges we all face.

The point I am really trying to make is to express my gratitude to my coworkers and family who have been so understanding and supportive for this entire year. Mom's declining health meant time away from work, but animal rescue rarely takes a day off. My colleagues covered shifts, made the right decisions, and kept CDHS operating at full speed. I took lots of time to be with Mom and have no regrets about that time spent with her. I know she is enjoying a happy reunion with the family she loved and missed, and I am comforted that she is no longer in pain. Life can be cruel, and life isn't fair. But if you surround yourself with people who care about you and help when you need it the most, you have made some wise and life-affirming choices.

Losing people and losing pets can be a loss that we sometimes question if we can even recover from. But take the steps you need to help you navigate the tough times in life and get yourself back to being there for the people and pets that need you. Setbacks are ok. It takes lots of time, and everyone processes these life-altering events in their own way. So, as well as a heartfelt thank you to my awesome coworkers, family, friends, and loved ones, this is also a gentle nudge to strive to "get back on the horse" because there is still a lot of work to be done.

Editor's Note: Sue's mom, JoAnne, was a longtime dedicated and hardworking CDHS shelter volunteer. She spent many, MANY years doing laundry in

our old building, surrounded by several cats and the occasional mouse. Her perfect laundry folding technique could not be replicated by anyone, even though many of us tried. Although we didn't see her at the shelter much in the last several years, she was still eager to spend volunteer time at home stuffing envelopes, sticking stamps, and inevitably finding address errors that we had missed. She was one smart cookie. As we know Sue misses her so much, the staff who knew and loved her miss her too – her smart wit, her easy laugh, her dedication to helping the animals, and the way she said, "Susie" when talking about her daughter (or "Susan" when she was in trouble). Rest easy, JoAnne. Take care of all those critters and keep the laundry running.
